Reflection by Rev. Richard J. Smith

What a celebration we had last week. The closing of our Centennial Celebrations went as perfectly as any of us could have asked. As I said in my remarks at the Gala, there were so many people who helped make this year possible that it would be impossible to list them all. I am so blessed to be a pastor of a parish that has such a dedicated parish family. We are now presented with the task of taking this joy and energy of this celebration into the future. What perfect timing that this weekend we hear the Gospel of the Sower. There are multiple ways we can receive this Gospel today. Allow me to offer you two possibilities. The first is asking how we receive the Word of God into our lives. Are we the rocky ground that only accepts the Word of God briefly or are we the fertile ground that lets it find a deep home and prosper? We also have the role of being the Sower himself. As the Word of God grows in each of us, we are called to share it. Recently, there has been this push for Missionary Discipleship. This is an idea of attending classes to help spread the Gospel. I believe we can all do this without the need for classes. Just by sharing with others what it means to follow Jesus is what we have all been called to do. For centuries, the joy and excitement that people have from encountering Christ is what helped to drive the Church forward. We now have an adoration chapel where we can encounter Christ even more than before. Let us all take advantage of this opportunity not just for ourselves but so we can nurture this excitement we have experienced this last year. If we can do this and share it with our community, our parish will continue to grow for another one hundred years.

Tengo mucha suerte de ser párroco de una parroquia que tiene una familia parroquial tan dedicada. Ahora se nos presenta la tarea de llevar esta alegría y energía de esta celebración al futuro. Qué momento perfecto para que este fin de semana escuchemos el Evangelio del Sembrador. Hay múltiples maneras en que podemos recibir este Evangelio hoy. Permítame ofrecerle dos posibilidades. La primera es preguntar cómo recibimos la Palabra de Dios en nuestras vidas. ¿Somos el terreno pedregoso que sólo acepta brevemente la Palabra de Dios o somos el terreno fértil que le permite encontrar un hogar profundo y prosperar? También tenemos el papel de ser el mismísimo Sembrador. A medida que la Palabra de Dios crece en cada uno de nosotros, estamos llamados a compartirla. Recientemente, ha habido este impulso para el Discipulado Misionero. Esta es una idea de asistir a clases para ayudar a difundir el Evangelio. Creo que todos podemos hacer esto sin necesidad de clases. Simplemente compartir con los demás lo que significa seguir a Jesús es lo que todos hemos sido llamados a hacer. Durante siglos, el gozo y el entusiasmo que la gente siente al encontrar a Cristo es lo que ayudó a impulsar a la Iglesia hacia adelante. Ahora contamos con una capilla de adoración donde podemos encontrar a Cristo aún más que antes. Aprovechemos todos esta oportunidad no sólo para nosotros, sino para alimentar el entusiasmo que hemos experimentado el año pasado. Si podemos hacer esto y compartirlo con nuestra comunidad, nuestra parroquia seguirá creciendo por otros cien años.




Spring Show
