SUNDAY, MARCH 31, 2024 **Reflection by Rev. Richard J. Smith**

Last night at the Easter Vigil, the opening prayer called on all of us to come together to watch and to pray. We are watching praying for the Resurrection. It was a beautiful night as we welcomed into our Church the light of Christ not just into our hearts but also into our parish. This light that we bless and praise God for brings everyone home. It is also a reminder that we should not leave this light in the Church but bring it with us into our own homes, where we work, and to the entire world. On this day, as we renew our Baptismal promises, we are reminded just how much the Resurrection means for all of us. It means, as you have heard me say so often, that our lives are defined by the love and mercy of God.

Over these last forty days, we have been prayerfully watching for this moment. A moment that exists in and out of time. A moment that occurred two thousand years ago and has lost none of its potency or importance in our lives. It is a moment that will guide us in our lives. As we sang in the Exultate last night, this is the night when Christ broke the prison bars of death. This is the day that we are called to celebrate with every fiber of our being holding nothing back in exultation. Let us today celebrate the Resurrection of our Lord and live in the light of Christ.

The empty tomb is discovered, and the risen Jesus first appears to Mary Magdalene, She in turn becomes His messenger to Peter and John. They in turn enter the tomb and see the burial cloths in one place and the head cloth neatly rolled up in another.

Fifth Grade Fun

This year is moving fast and fifth grade is learning so much! We are GROWING too! This year we are mentoring fourth grade by showing them how to grow lettuce and basil in the Hydroponic Vertical Garden. Growing using the "Fork Farm" has been an all-encompassing curriculum endeavor. We used Math to measure, Science to hypothesize, Social Studies to learn about connections to our community and the outcome was lots of knowledge and fun!

During the Lenten season, fifth grade students made reflection bags with significant items to help us pray and draw closer to Jesus. We meditated on Matthew 4:1-11, about Jesus going into the desert to pray and fast. Then we filled our bags with sand, a stone, a seed, an image of Jesus and a candle. Each item represents a way we can reflect on our faith. This practice as well as our weekly devotion to the Stations of the Cross and our "40 Day Cross Challenge" strengthened our faith this Lent.

We have two field trips planned in the next few months. Our first is to support our local Catholic High School, Pope John Paul II HS by going to see their production of *The Wizard of* Oz. We are also excited to take a walking tour of Historical Philadelphia where we will see the Betsy Ross House, the Liberty Bell and many other places and monuments!

Looking ahead to the third trimester, we are excited to explore a unit on pioneers in Social Studies. As a part of this unit, we will use STEAM skills to build a prairie schooner and build a model of a log cabin. In Math, our students will become teachers and teach the class dividing fractions as a presentation.
