You see, both priests and the people have the same mission, to help others move closer to God. A strong healthy parish has this balance where the pastor and the parishioners work together to raise everyone in their faith. As we enter into the next chapter of our parish, let it begin with this. Gospel: Mark 12: 38-44, or 12: 41-44

The two characters featured here, the scribe and the widow, are starkly contrasted. Jesus favors the poor widow He had observed donating her whole livelihood to the temple treasury.
