

SUNDAY, August 4, 2024

Reflection by Rev. Richard J. Smith

Over the next few weeks, we will be hearing from the Gospel of John. In particular, his Bread of Life discourse. This is where Jesus, in John's Gospel, talks about the Eucharist, the Bread of Life. It is so important that we pay close attention to these passages. I can not write nor preach enough about the importance of the Eucharist. In over two thousand years of saints, mystics, popes and every other person you can think of preaching and writing on the Eucharist, we still have not exhausted what the Eucharist is for all of us. How sad it is then to see how we treat the Eucharist. Several years ago, the Bishops conference did a study to see if people actually believe in the True Presence in the Eucharist. At that time, only one third believed that Jesus was truly in the Eucharist. That same study was done a month ago, and it has now increased to two thirds. How can we help to make this 100%? I believe it can be done and we can do it. It is in the small changes we can make here that will lead to a better appreciation and respect to the Eucharist. Think on how we present ourselves to receive the Eucharist. There is a simple gesture we all do, a small bow, before receiving. This bow is part of our recognition in the true presence. Our Amen, when asked the question The Body of Christ, verbalizes that belief in the true presence. Our time in prayer and thanksgiving after we have received shows our appreciation and love for the true presence in the Eucharist. I call on all of you to reflect on these three elements; the bow, the Amen, and your prayer of thanksgiving. Can we celebrate all three with more devotion? Over the next few weeks, you will hear me encourage all of you to grow in your devotion and faith in the Eucharist. If we can do this, then the next time a study is asked, "Do you believe in the True Presence?", it will be all of us who say yes.

Este es en donde Jesus, en el evangelio de Juan, habla de la Eucaristía, el Pan de Vida. Es muy importante que prestemos mucha atención a estos pasajes. Yo no puedo escribir o predicar lo suficiente sobre la importancia de la Eucaristía. En más de dos mil años de santos, místicos, papas, y cada otra persona que puedan pensar en predicar o escribir sobre la Eucaristía, todavía no hemos agotado lo que es la Eucaristía para todos nosotros. Qué triste es ver cómo tratamos a la Eucaristía. Hace varios años, la Conferencia Episcopal hizo un estudio para ver si la gente realmente cree en la Verdadera Presencia en la Eucaristía. En ese momento, solo un tercio creía que Jesús estaba verdaderamente presente en la Eucaristía. Ese mismo estudio se hizo hace un mes, y ahora ha aumentado a dos tercios de los que creen. ¿Cómo podemos ayudar a que esto sea 100%? Creo que se puede hacer y podemos hacerlo. Es en los pequeños cambios que podemos hacer aquí los que conducirán a una mejor apreciación y respeto de la Eucaristía. Piensen en cómo nos presentamos para recibir la Eucaristía. Hay un simple gesto que todos hacemos, una pequeña reverencia, antes de recibir. Esta reverencia es parte de nuestro reconocimiento en la verdadera presencia. Nuestro Amén, cuando se le hace la pregunta El Cuerpo de Cristo, verbaliza esa creencia en la verdadera presencia. Nuestro tiempo en oración y acción de gracias después de haber recibido demuestra nuestro aprecio y amor por la verdadera presencia en la Eucaristía. Les pido a todos ustedes que reflexionen sobre estos tres elementos; la inclinación, el Amén y tu oración de acción de gracias. ¿Podemos celebrar los tres con más devoción? En las próximas semanas, me escucharán animarlos a todos a crecer en su devoción y fe en la Eucaristía. Si podemos hacer esto, entonces la próxima vez que se le pregunte en un estudio: "¿Cree usted en la Verdadera Presencia?", seremos todos nosotros los que digamos que sí.

Saint of the Week: Saint Dominic

Feast Day: August 8

St. Dominic was born in Caleruega, on August 8, 1170. He was named after St. Dominic of Silos. He was brought up by his parents and a maternal uncle who was an archbishop. He began his studies in the Monastery at age 14, and was ordained at 24.

Did you know... St. Dominic is the Patron Saint of astronomers and the Dominican Republic? The country of the Dominican Republic is named after Saint Dominic!

In 1215, Dominic established himself & 6 followers, which began the Dominicans. He subjected himself and his companions to the monastic rules of prayer and penance. He began to travel and open additional convents and monasteries, and was known for "selecting the worst accommodations and the meanest clothes", and "never allowed himself the luxury of a bed". He also was known for abstaining from meat, and frequently travelled barefoot.

Did you know... the Dominican Order is credited for the spread of the Rosary throughout the world?
