

Reflection by Rev. Richard J. Smith

"Zeal for your house will consume me " We see this as the line of why Jesus clears the temple so it is a house of prayer once again. For perspective, imagine I was selling lottery tickets from the pulpit. That is what was happening in the Temple when Jesus walked in. People were allowed to sell things but they had moved to a place where they were not supposed to be. It is the zeal that Jesus had for the Temple that caught my attention this week. You do not hear people talking about a house of prayer like that. Yes, we believe a Church can be beautiful and can be inspiring but do we ever have zeal for our Church?

Does our Church ever move us to change how we present ourselves or how we conduct ourselves? Now, I'm not talking about the physical building but what happens inside that building should drive our zeal. The miracle of the Eucharist happens in that building. Sins are forgiven in that building. Baptisms, Weddings, and Funerals happen in that building. All that we believe and act on can be found in that building. Shouldn't this inspire us to do more than just show up on time? Should we not be inspired to present ourselves in the best possible way instead of jeans and a Phillies hoodie? Should it not compel us to spend as much time as we can in this building to experience our faith? Let us this Lent stop and consider how we are showing our appreciation but also our zeal for all that has been given to us in this building.

Todo lo que creemos y en lo que actuamos se puede encontrar en ese edificio. ¿No debería esto inspirarnos a hacer algo más que llegar a tiempo? ¿No deberíamos inspirarnos para presentarnos de la mejor manera posible en lugar de jeans y una sudadera con capucha de los Phillies? ¿No debería obligarnos a pasar tanto tiempo como podamos en este edificio para experimentar nuestra fe? Detengámonos en esta Cuaresma y consideremos cómo estamos mostrando nuestro aprecio pero también nuestro celo por todo lo que se nos ha dado en este edificio.
