SUNDAY, APRIL 14, 2024

Reflection by Rev. Richard J. Smith

The Acts of the Apostles should be a great guide to all of us. We see in this book how the early days of the Church responded to the Resurrection. Now, you would think that we would see a lot of condemning of the people for rejecting Jesus. You would think you would see the Apostles strolling around being smug. You do not see any of that. What you do see is Peter pointing out the mistakes of the people who rejected Christ but in a compassionate manner. He does not tell them that they are all doomed. He does not tell them that it is too late. Peter does the exact opposite. He tells them that there is still time and that they can still choose to accept Christ as the Messiah. He encourages them to see that, as I say often, they are not defined by their sins and poor choices, but by the love of Christ. How amazing to hear that the love that they all rejected is still being offered to them and can still be accepted by them. Now let us jump to our society today. The list of people who reject Christ and his Church goes down to Miami and back. Despite this, the love they have rejected is still theirs to receive and transform their lives. You and I are called today to help people see that. We are not called to denounce or condemn any of them. So, to those who are struggling with anything, same sex attraction, abortion, gender identity, addiction, we are here not to condemn or belittle. We are called today to help them see that through their struggles, Jesus is still there for them and willing to be in their lives.

Lo que sí ves es a Pedro señalando los errores de las personas que rechazaron a Cristo, pero de manera compasiva. No les dice que todos están condenados. No les dice que ya es demasiado tarde. Peter hace exactamente lo contrario. Les dice que todavía hay tiempo y que todavía pueden elegir aceptar a Cristo como el Mesías. Les anima a ver que, como digo a menudo, no están definidos por sus pecados y malas decisiones, sino por el amor de Cristo. Qué sorprendente escuchar que el amor que todos rechazaron todavía se les ofrece y todavía pueden aceptarlo. Ahora saltemos a nuestra sociedad actual. La lista de personas que rechazan a Cristo y su Iglesia llega hasta Miami y regresa. A pesar de esto, el amor que han rechazado todavía es suyo para recibirlo y transformar sus vidas. Usted y yo estamos llamados hoy a ayudar a la gente a ver eso. No estamos llamados a denunciar ni condenar a ninguno de ellos. Entonces, para aquellos que están luchando con cualquier cosa, atracción hacia personas del mismo sexo, aborto, identidad de género, adicción, no estamos aquí para condenarlos ni menospreciarlos. Estamos llamados hoy a ayudarlos a ver que a través de sus luchas, Jesús todavía está ahí para ellos y dispuesto a estar en sus vidas.

Third Sunday of Easter

Reading I: Acts 3: 13-15, 17-19

Peter's sermon theme is that the suffering Messiah was raised from the dead. This implies our personal need for repentance and conversion.

Reading II: I John 2: 1-5a

The author connects knowledge of Christ with observance of His commands. This in turn leads to a deep love of God.

Gospel: Luke 24: 35-38

The main point is not the reality of Jesus' body as much as it is His victory over death by His renewal of the table fellowship with His disciples. Preaching repentance "to all nations" becomes their mission.

Middle School ELA

The new year began our studies on writing, genre, and literary and story elements. Both seventh and eighth grades learned about the four main types of writing (expository, narrative, descriptive, and persuasive). We began to explore the defining features of these four writing styles, with more explanation and learning to come. Students wrote something using each of these four writing types.

Since the middle of January, seventh grade has focused a great deal on the different types of writing and film genres. They are able to understand that genre is a specific type of writing with its own identifiable characteristics. They have done two film assignments using the Science Fiction and Fantasy genres, as well as worked on collaborative assignments that focused on other genres.

Both Middle School English Language Arts (ELA) classes are still learning about protagonist, antagonist, and villain, and the differences between each of the three characters. Both classes are also still learning about the six types of literary conflicts (person vs. person, person vs. self, person vs. nature, person vs. society, person vs. technology, and person vs. supernatural). Miss Akers is incorporating ideas and entertainment that excite the students and make them want to get involved.


SFA PRO-LIFE
