

Reflection by Rev. Richard J. Smith

The month of November is dedicated to the Holy Souls in Purgatory. This is a month for us to remember all those who have gone before us marked with the sign of faith. We can do this in many different ways. We can have a mass celebrated for them. We can offer our rosary or daily prayers so that their time in Purgatory can be lessened. We can offer up any of our difficulties and sacrifices for them as well. Another tradition is to visit their graves and spend some time in prayer. Whatever we choose to honor them and help them, it points to a greater reality in our lives. This is not the end. There is a greater purpose and existence for all of us. So many of the readings for the Feast Day of All Souls (Nov. 2nd) encourage us to see this truth. Many of these same readings we hear at a funeral mass. They all point to the joy and peace that awaits for us in Heaven and this is a joy we can count on. As Paul says in the letter to the Romans, "Hope does not disappoint, because the love of God has been poured out into our hearts". The hope of eternal life is what we are called to reflect on this month. Let us take some extra time this month to pray for our deceased family and friends that they are enjoying the warm embrace of paradise.

Todas apuntan a la alegría y paz que nos espera en el cielo y esta es una alegría con la que contamos. Como Pablo dice en la carta a los Romanos, "La esperanza no decepciona, porque el amor de Dios ha sido derramado en nuestros corazones." La esperanza de vida eterna es lo que somos llamados a reflexionar este mes. Tomemos un tiempo extra este mes para rezar por nuestras familias y amigos fallecidos que estén disfrutando del cálido abrazo del paraíso.

Reading I: Deuteronomy 6: 2-6

Along with the call to "hear" comes the command to love God fully. The great "Shema" (v.6 -9) appears for the first time as Israel's act of faith.

Reading II: Hebrews 7: 23-28

The priesthood of Jesus is not bound by time, for He is "higher than the heavens" and is perfect. Through Him we are united with God.

Gospel: Mark 12: 28b-34

Jesus, prompted by a questioning Scribe, issues the great two-part Commandment. He forever equates love of God with love of neighbor.


