Reflection by Rev. Richard J. Smith

The season of Lent has so much going on that it is easy to get lost in all of it. Trying to juggle all the different spiritual exercises, presentations, and other events that come only during this time of the year can be exhausting. I know I must check my calendar every morning just to remind myself what is going on. It is a blessing, then, to have Peter's letter today to remind us and focus on what these forty days are all about.

"Christ suffered for sins once, the righteous for the sake of the unrighteous, that he might lead you to God." What a clear description of what Jesus came into our world to do. This is very profound to see just how much Jesus took on for us who in no way deserved it. Now as clear as Peter explains to us the mission of Jesus, it is still called upon us to explore what this means for each of us. How has the suffering of Jesus made my life better? This is why we have the season of Lent.

Let us commit ourselves this Lent to better understanding the suffering Christ freely took on for our sins. Let us this Lent open ourselves even more to his guidance so we can have a deeper relationship with God.

The story of the Great Flood and Noah's leadership is one in which the world is cleansed by water. There follows a covenant between God and the people symbolized by a rainbow which will mean the end of future rainstorms before they destroy the world.

The victory of Christ over sin is applied to Christians by baptism. This was prefigured by the cleansing waters of the Great Flood.

Gospel: Mark 1: 12-15

The brief and simple narrative of Mark contrasts with the more elaborate scriptural debate between the devil and Jesus, as portrayed in both Matthew and Luke, both of which followed Mark in time.

School News

6th Grade News

Our 1st Trimester began with laughter and getting to know each other and quickly moved onto our Summer Reading Group project. Students were grouped by the Summer Reading Book they had read and asked to "go deeper" into reading comprehension and a small sample of each of their writing. Since then, we have been reviewing our grammar, working on new vocabulary and beginning our first essay in conjunction with their Spanish and STREAM project on the Day of the Dead. Within this project students also received a Religion grade on their altar (ofrenda).

In our Science class, we reviewed Science 'vocabulary and the scientific method and began working on our first LabLearner CELL on the Properties of Matter. Students had four investigations in this section of science where they experimented with chemicals, learned about atoms and molecules, and finally how to identify compounds and elements through investigations.

Religion began with reviewing our prayers, talking about the saint of the day, going to Mass with our Prayer Partners in 3rd Grade on Tuesday mornings and learning how to navigate the Bible and understanding what it means to live our faith every day.

So, what is in our 6th Grade future? We will be reading Hidden Figures, the Young Readers edition as a class. In this we will identify new vocabulary and talk about writing with figurative language and imagery as well as the science of this very important time in our history. Literature will also be our focus and students will be expected to compare different genres of Literature and identify the difference in the writing styles as well as writing their own poetry journals.

I am so excited to be a part of this faith family of Saint Francis of Assisi and to watch these amazing young students deepen their knowledge and faith as a joint venture.

Please do not light candles without donating money. Thank you.




