Reflection by Rev. Richard J. Smith

John today gives us a challenge and a solution to that challenge in our lives as Catholics. His challenge comes in his letter. Our faith needs to be more than just "word and speech but in deed and truth." It is not enough to say that we are Catholic but we must also conduct ourselves as we are Catholic. Now this is not easy, especially in our world today. We have seen many people arrested for their Catholic faith and attacked in their own homes for their public profession of their Catholic faith. It is moments like this that I am reminded of a homily I heard as a child: If you think being a Catholic is easy, then you are not doing it right. I truly believe that all of us have a desire to live out our Catholic faith to the best of our ability but so many things get in the way. Sometimes it is fear and other times it can be a lack of conviction. We see it but we do not know how to rise above it. John then gives us the solution to our difficulties. "Whoever remains in me and I in him will bear much fruit." Our success as Catholics depends on how united we are to Christ. This again can not be simply saying I believe in Jesus. We must actively work with Him and pursue Him. This can be done with frequent reception of the Eucharist on Sundays, going to Confession at least once a month, and having a daily prayer life. By spending more time with Jesus and engaging Him in the sacraments, we will be given the grace and strength to live the life of a Catholic. I encourage all of you today, let your profession in Jesus not just be your words but with every action you take. Open your hearts and souls to the Sacraments so you can have the grace and strength to show the world that you are a follower of Christ.

Juan hoy nos presenta un desafío y una solución a ese desafío en nuestras vidas como católicos. Su desafío viene en su carta. Nuestra fe debe ser más que sólo "palabra y discurso, sino en hechos y en verdad". No basta con decir que somos católicos sino que también debemos comportarnos como somos católicos. Ahora bien, esto no es fácil, especialmente en nuestro mundo actual. Hemos visto a muchas personas arrestadas por su fe católica y atacadas en sus propios hogares por su profesión pública de su fe católica. En momentos como este recuerdo una homilía que escuché cuando era niño: Si crees que ser católico es fácil, entonces no lo estás haciendo bien. Realmente creo que todos tenemos el deseo de vivir nuestra fe católica lo mejor que podamos, pero hay muchas cosas que se interponen en nuestro camino. A veces es miedo y otras puede ser falta de convicción. Lo vemos pero no sabemos cómo superarlo. Luego Juan nos da la solución a nuestras dificultades. "El que permanece en mí y yo en él, dará mucho fruto". Nuestro éxito como católicos depende de cuán unidos estemos a Cristo. Nuevamente, esto no puede ser simplemente decir: Creo en Jesús. Debemos trabajar activamente con Él y buscarlo. Esto se puede hacer con la recepción frecuente de la Eucaristía los domingos, confesándose al menos una vez al mes y teniendo una vida de oración diaria. Al pasar más tiempo con Jesús e involucrarnos en los sacramentos, recibiremos la gracia y la fuerza para vivir una vida católica. Los animo a todos ustedes hoy a que su profesión en Jesús no sea solo con sus palabras sino con cada acción que realicen. Abre tu corazón y tu alma a los Sacramentos para que puedas tener la gracia y la fuerza de mostrarle al mundo que eres un seguidor de Cristo.

Jesus describes Himself as the true vine, replacing the older image of Israel as the vine. The disciples, representing Jesus in the world, give glory to the Father.
