

SUNDAY, MARCH 24, 2024 ______ Reflection by Rev. Richard J. Smith

"Hosanna to the Son of David! O Blest is he, O Blest is he who comes in the name of the Lord!" This hymn we sang this weekend at the beginning of all our Masses echoes the crowd in Jerusalem over two thousand years ago. They were so excited that Jesus was coming into Jerusalem. We too should also be excited for our Lord's entrance into Jerusalem. Here is where things differ. The people of Jerusalem believed he would come and reestablish the kingdom of Israel. We should be excited because we know we are getting a lot more than a kingdom.

Today kicks off our salvation. Since Christmas, we have been preparing for this moment. Since Ash Wednesday, we have been singularly focused on what this will mean for all of us. In the upcoming days, we will dive deeper into each part of our salvation and how much our Lord reaches out to us. There is so much excitement that has been built up for this week that today we should sing Hosanna as loudly as we can. When we come to the liturgies this week on Thursday, Friday and Saturday, let us do so with an enthusiasm that would rival that day two thousand years ago. We have so much to celebrate on this Palm Sunday. Let's make sure they can hear us across Norristown, Pennsylvania, and throughout the world.

Reading I: Isaiah 50: 4-7

From the prophet's "Book of Comfort" section we find an obvious reference to Jesus, whose confidence remains even with His face covered in spittle.

Sunday of Reading II: Philippians 2: 6-11

Paul quotes a beautiful hymn of his time which describes Christ's self-emptying and His exaltation. The hymn may have been in Aramaic.

Passion of Gospel: Mark 14:1-15:47, or 15: 1-39

Mark's gospel has been described as "A Passion narrative with a long introduction." He wrote to comfort his community sometime in the 60's AD before the destruction of the Temple in 70 AD.

1st Grade

First Grade just keeps getting better! We have been very busy and working hard every day. Our favorite time of day is our Jesus Time. We are learning about God's love, the Church Year, and the Blessed Trinity.
